In 1887, area was in pioneer town of
 Somerville and park was named
 "Somerville Park" until 1907 (?) when
 district was annexed to Seattle.
 Somerville was founded in 1872 by
 Chas. Waters from Somerville, Mass.,
 whose land grant incl. 350 acres.
 (Refer: Lakeridge Park = Waters Ave.)

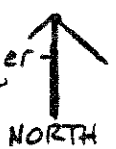

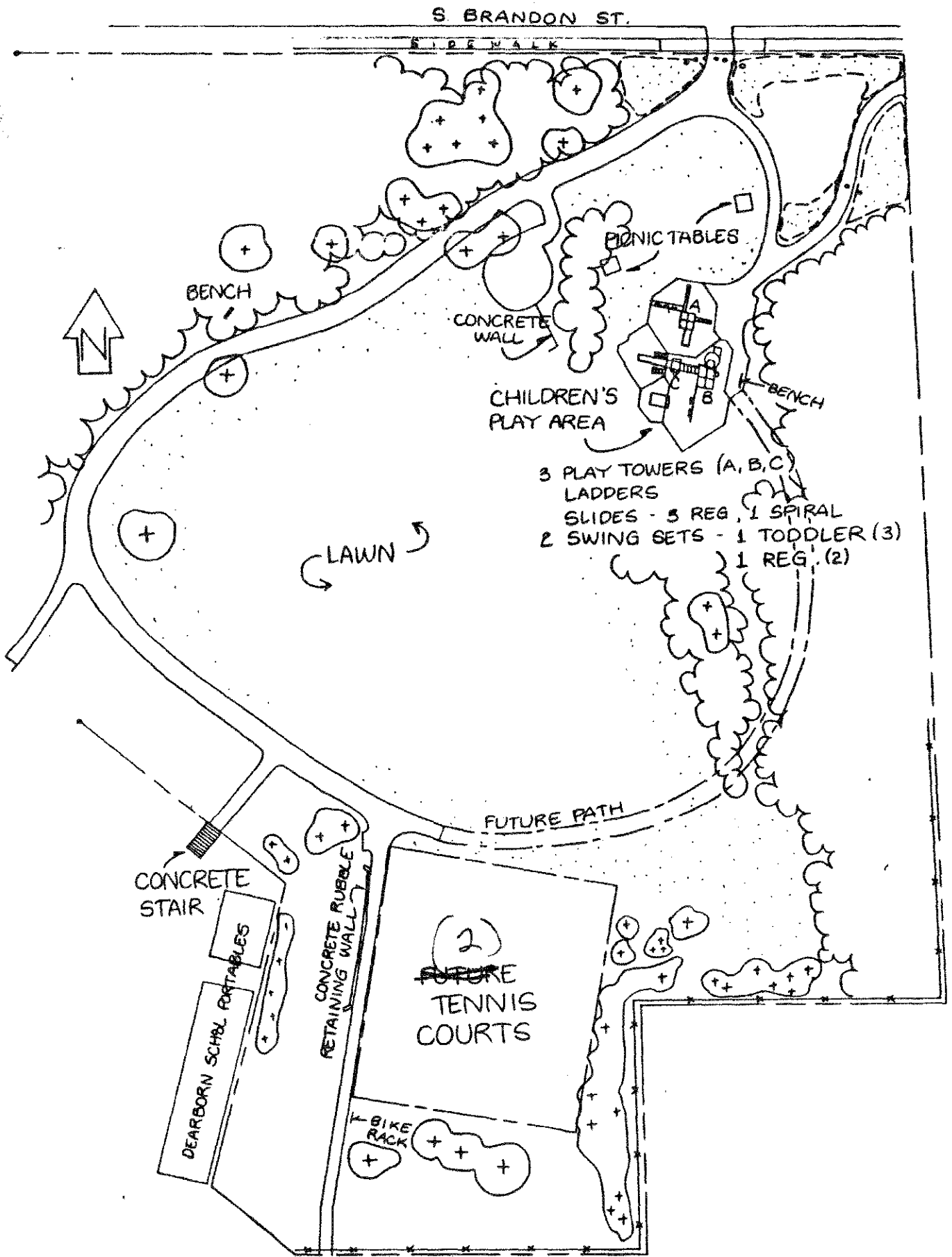
