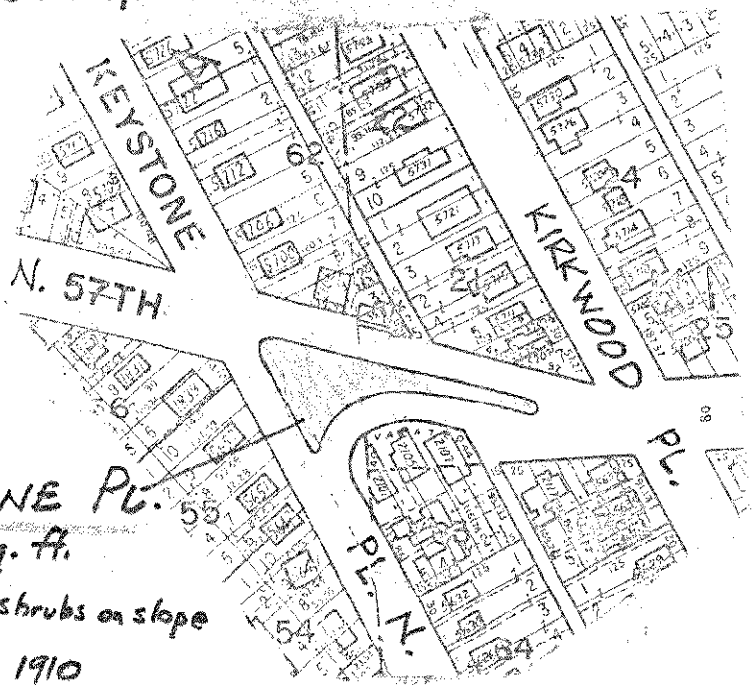


CRESCENT PL.

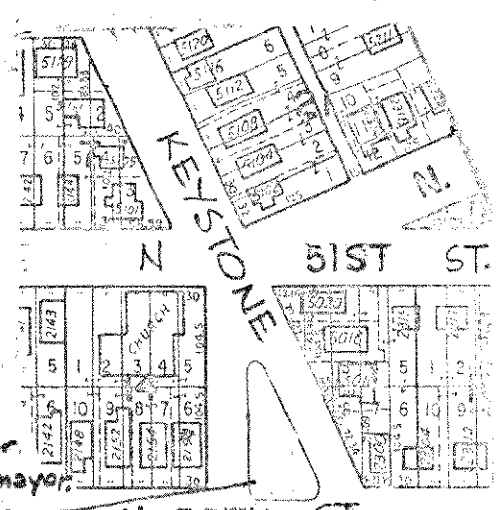
KEYSTONE PL.

Named by W.D. Wood, realtor to honor Corliss P. Stone, Seattle's 2nd mayor.

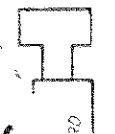
