From 1991 to 2005, Piers 62 and 63 on the waterfront were home to the popular "Summer Nights at the Pier" concert series. Unfortunately in 2005 it was determined the piers were in need of major renovations, and could no longer support the event. However, a new proposal from the Seattle Office of the Waterfront is proposing an accelerated revamp of the space, which could bring music and events back as soon as 2019. The Pathé building, one of the last remnants of Belltown's historic "Film Row," is up for re-development. "Film Row" was cluster of movie-distribution centers for major Hollywood studios and film companies that began forming in the neighborhood in the era of silent movies. Pathé, founded in France in 1896, is now a major film production and distribution company which owns many theater chains in Europe. 35 YEARS OF MUSIC AND LGBT HISTORY FOR RETIRING SEATTLE CHORUS DIRECTOR

For over 35 years, Dennis Coleman has been in front of not only the Seattle Men's and Women's choruses, but also some of the biggest changes in LGBT history. Both of the choruses identify as LGBT organizations, and during Coleman's tenure he's lent the organizations voice to support for the AIDS crisis in the '80s and early '90s, the passage of same-sex marriage in 2015, and most recently the tragic events in Orlando.



HISTORIC WASHINGTON HALL RETURNS TO SERVE THE CENTRAL DISTRICT

Historic Seattle purchased Washington Hall seven years ago - and now, \$9.8 million in renovations later, the building is again ready to serve the diverse community it has called home for 100 years. The grand-reopening on June 10 (which featured a performance recreating Seattle's first-ever documented jazz performance, held at Washington Hall in 1918), signaled a new era for the building, which will once again house community organizations, live music, and is available for rent to the public.
