



Rainier Avenue South Road Safety Corridor Project

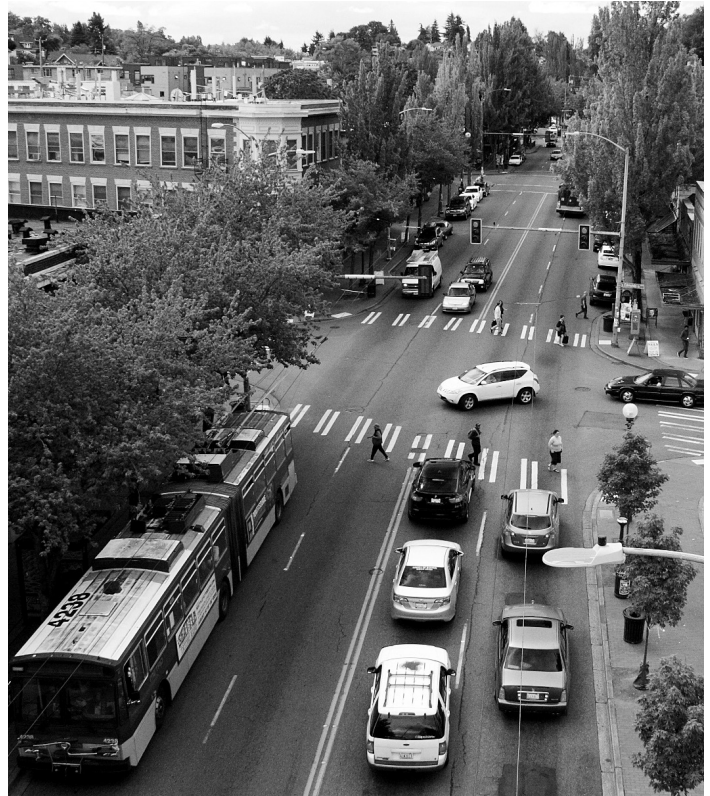
Road work planned for first two weeks of August

The Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) will start work on the Rainier Avenue South Road Safety Corridor Project on Monday, August 3. The goal of this project is to make Rainier Avenue South safer for everyone by reducing speeds, improving pedestrian crossings, and improving turning movements at intersections.

Project elements

City crews will make a number of changes to traffic signals, signs, and pavement markings on Rainier Ave S:

- Remove existing pavement markings
- Install new pavement markings including:
 - One travel lane in each direction
 - A center turn lane to accommodate left turning vehicles
 - New transit lanes
- New transit signal systems and signs
- Longer signal cycles for vehicles and pedestrians
- New 25 mph speed limit signs
- Crack sealing to preserve pavement conditions



WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- Construction will occur on Rainier Ave S, between S Alaska and S Kenny streets
- SDOT crews will work mainly between the hours of 9 AM and 3 PM with some work anticipated at night between the hours of 7 PM and 5 AM
- Rainier Ave S will remain open to traffic during construction, but expect periodic lane closures
- Temporary parking restrictions
- Moderate construction noise
- We will maintain access to businesses and residences
- Work will be complete no later than Friday, August 14
